Daniel A. DeBacker, seaman apprentice, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. G. C. DeBacker, of O'Neill, has arrived aboard the amphibious force landing craft tender, USS Satyr, after 11 months in the Far East.

The commanding officer of the Satyr was designated a representative for commander amphibious force in the Far East while coordinating the movements of red prisoners of war from Pusan, Korea, to the Island of Koje. During these operations she was based in Pusan Harbor.

The Satyr later assumed duties as amphibious force landing craft tender in the Far East, operating at Pusan and Suyong in Korea and Sasebo and Yokosuka, Japan.
