Duane Lauridsen, 3-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Louie Lauridsen, is visiting the Hans Lauridsen family for a few days.

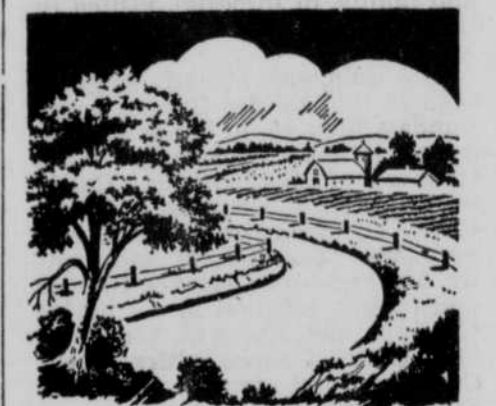
