**Embargo Still in Effect**

- The embargo on feeder hogs is still in effect in Nebraska at all market agencies. This is because of an outbreak last week of vesicular exanthema, a virus infection. In our regular sale today (Thursday) we will be selling fat hogs, as usual, but will not be selling feeders.
- Because of rigid disinfection rules, trucks arriving at and leaving our yards must be disinfected. We are asking that all trucks be as clean as possible when arriving. This will make the disinfection procedure quick and orderly.
- The cattle market is about the same as last week. There will be several packages of steer calves and heifer calves and the usual run of butcher cattle. Inquiries are beginning to come from out-of-state buyers and soon the seasonal run will be underway.
