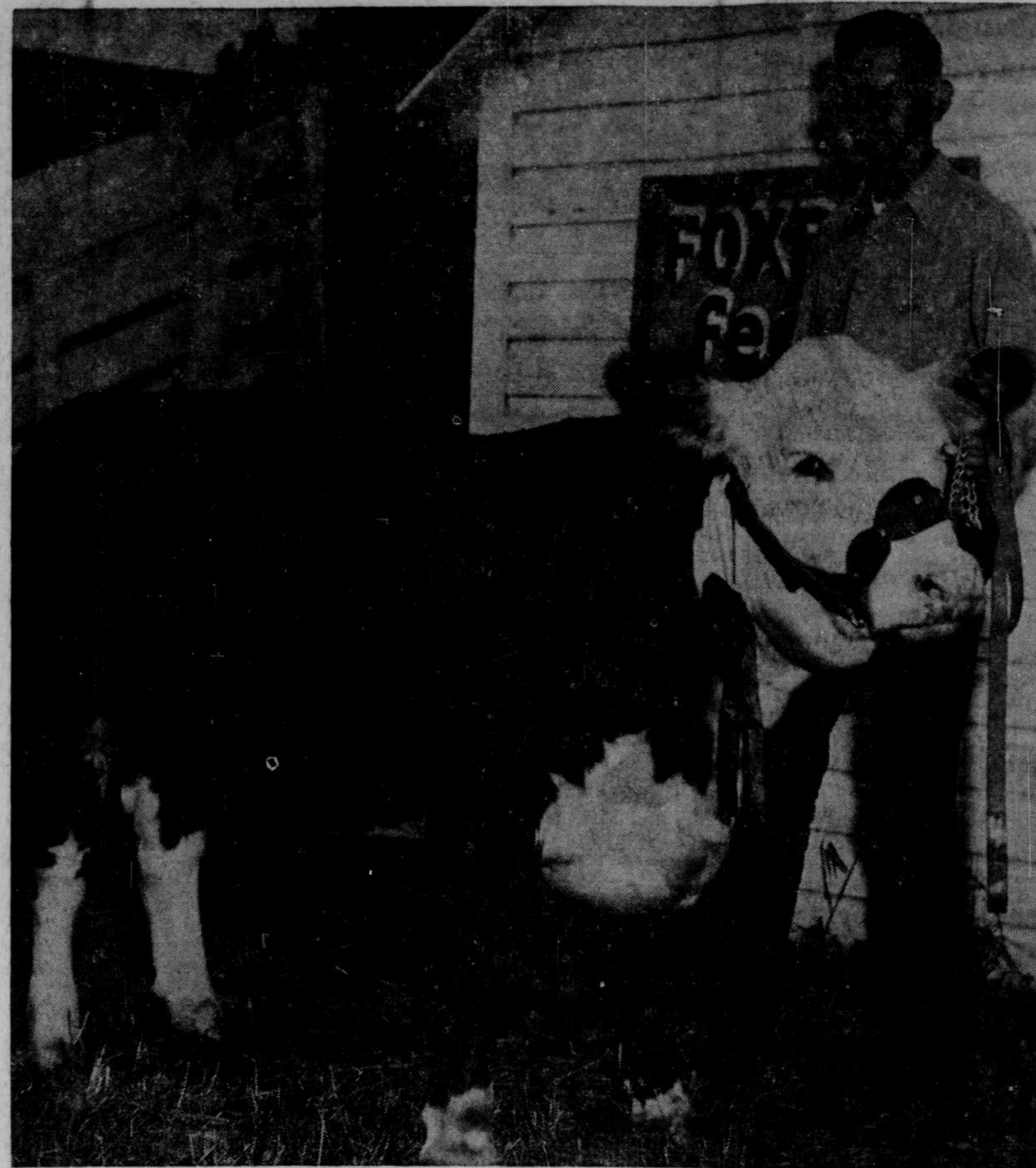
**EWING NEWS**

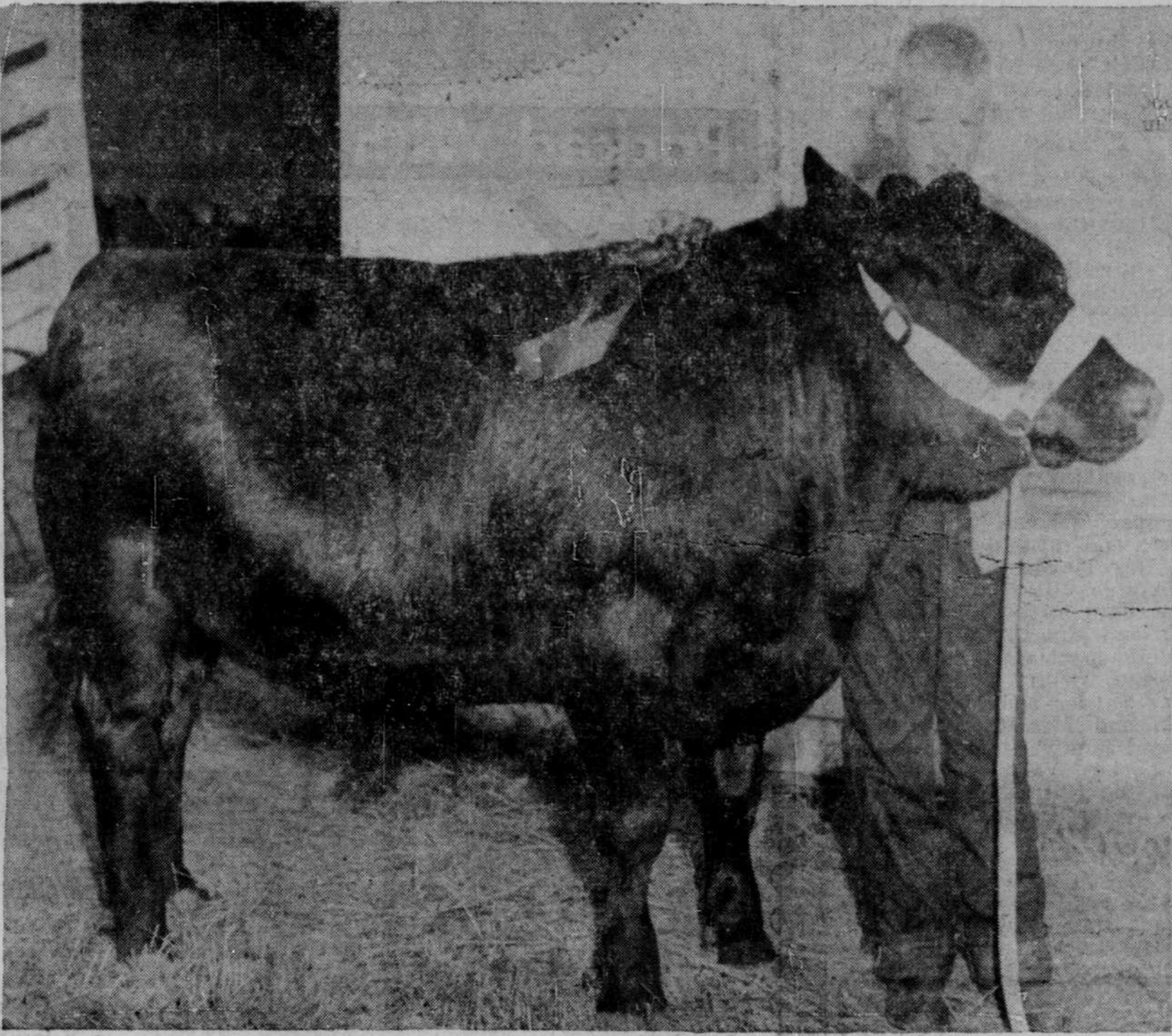
Mrs. Harold Harris, The Frontier's Ewing correspondent, was called to Iowa by the death of a sister-in-law.

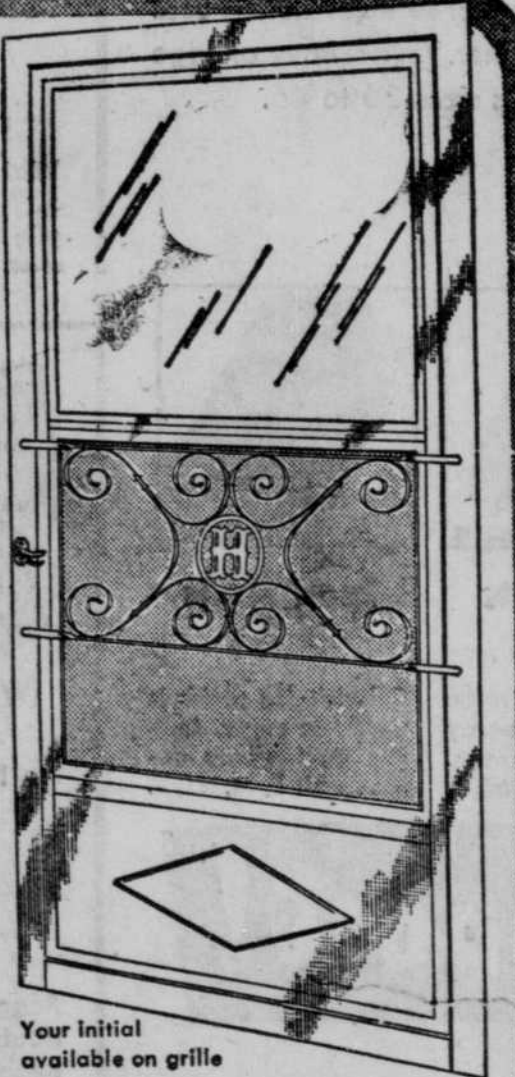
