

Raising 18 Chickens Didn't Pay But They Devoured Table Scraps

Ever hear of a quilted coffee cake? Well, it's sort of unusual. This recipe makes a dozen lazy daisy rolls and one of those quilted coffee cakes, so you'll likely want to give it a try.

LAZY DAISY ROLLS You'll need: One cake compressed yeast, 2 1/2 cups lukewarm scalded milk, 1/2 cup lard, two tablespoons sugar, two teaspoons salt, five cups flour, three-fourths cup jam.

QUILTED COFFEE CAKE Place the remaining dough in a 9-inch square pan, et rise until double in bulk. Make hollows in the dough 1 1/2 inches apart, with knife handle. Fill hollows with jam. Allow to rise 10 minutes. Bake in a moderately hot oven of 400 F. 35 to 40 minutes.
