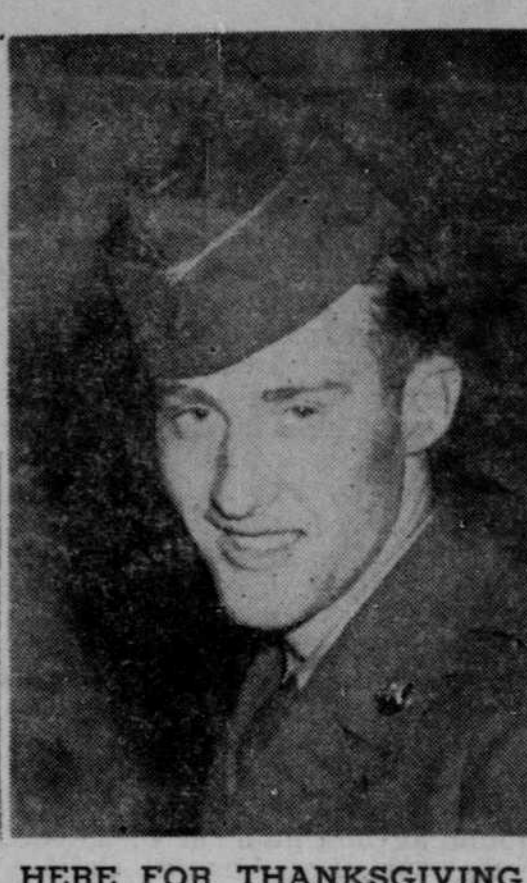

**Burival Fined \$5,000 on Income Tax Case**

Frank Burival, 51, O'Neill farmer, was fined \$2,500 and costs by Federal Judge James A. Donohoe in Omaha on each of two counts of income tax evasion.

The government alleges that Burival paid \$1,612.10 in income taxes in 1946 when he should have paid \$18,588.83, and \$2,351.11 in 1947 when his tax was \$14,107.06.

The fines are in addition to the automatic penalties exacted for income tax violations.

By coincidence, Judge Donohoe is a native O'Neillite.
