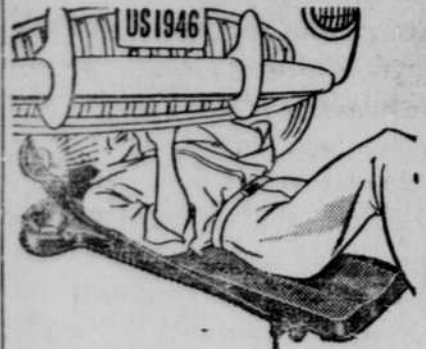

Chance who was found guilty of desertion by a general court-martial at MacDill Field, Florida, on August 9th, and was sentenced to be dishonorably discharged and confined at hard labor for five years.

NAACP OPPOSES ALABAMA'S APPEAL TO U. S. SUPREME COURT ON NEGRO VOTE

NEW YORK—To establish once and for all the right of Negroes to register and vote in the state of Alabama, the legal staff of the NAACP has filed a brief in the United States Supreme Court opposing a review of a decision of the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals in the case of Mitchell vs. Wayne which is being appealed by the registrars of voters in Macon County, Alabama.

A general of Peace greets a private of the fighting forces. General Albert Orsborn shakes hands with a United States soldier in The Salvation Army Red Shield Canteen in Philadelphia. General Orsborn, world leader of The Salvation Army, visited the canteen a few days after his arrival in the United States on a three-months' tour of the Western Hemisphere. He entered the building accompanied by a group of distinguished civic leaders and high-ranking Salvation Army Officers. Noticing a small group of soldiers and sailors at a table, the General walked away from his distinguished escort, shook hands with all of the members of the armed forces and passed several minutes chatting with them. General Orsborn's tour includes fourteen cities of the United States and about a dozen countries in North and South America.

FRENCH TOAST
8 eggs, slightly beaten
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup milk
6-8 slices bread, cut 1/2" half diagonally
1/2 cup Spzy
Combine eggs, salt, and milk. Dip slices of bread in mixture and saute in hot Spzy until golden brown on both sides. Serves 4 to 6.

SWEET APPLE RINGS
1 unpeeled apple, cored and cut into round slices about 1/4" inch thick
1/2 cup dark corn syrup
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
Try apple slices in hot Spzy until lightly browned. Add corn syrup and salt and cook slowly until apples are tender (about 2-5 minutes). Add vanilla. Serve apple slices and hot sirup over French Toast.
