Senator Johnson released memorandum which, in discussing whether the jury trial amendment weakened the bill, declared:

"When the purpose of the court is to enforce its order protecting the right to vote, it can imprison, it can fine, it can award compensatory civil damage, all without a jury trial ... . In election cases, where time for compliance may be short, the judge can require the posting of substantial bonds, which automatically become forfeited if the court order is violated."




