

ANOTHER HAMPTON PROFESSOR CALLED TO FEDERAL SERVICE

HAMPTON INSTITUTE, Va.—Another Hampton Institute worker has been called into the service of the federal government. This time the call comes to the director of extension work, Prof. William M. Cooper. He has been named a federal district supervisor of adult education for Negroes in Virginia; and is to assist in the educational work of the Hampton Institute.

Mr. Cooper's duties will include the supervision of extension work in the state, and the problem of obtaining rooms for instruction has become a matter of immediate concern. Mr. Cooper's duties include the counties of Southampton, Surry, Isle of Wight, Nansemond, Northampton, Princess Anne, Northampton, Accomack, Westmoreland, Elizabeth City, York, James City, Charles City, New Kent, King, William, King and Queen, and the counties of Gloucester and Mathews.

Two district supervisors from the Virginia State College at Petersburg, also have been appointed for the same type of work. They are Prof. Dorey A. Wilkerson, and Miss Wilhelmina E. Hamlin.

Dr. Cooper's years of experience in the conduct of extension work for Hampton Institute, are considered to have admirably fitted him for his new task in connection with his regular extension service.

NASHVILLE, Tenn.—Twenty-one

figures of August 1933 while increase of 25 per cent to 50 per cent were general. The widening of the demand for goods is the best experienced in several years.

The Association of Life Insurance Presidents has announced that total volume of new life insurance production for the first 9 months of 1934 showed an increase of 12.8 per cent over the same period of 1933.

ASK DEATH OF NEGRO AT MARIANNA, FLA. LYNCHING

NEW YORK (CNA)—The penalty of death for all persons involved in the lynching of Claude Neal, 28, Negro at Marianna, Fla., on the morning of October 27, is demanded in letters and telegrams to President Roosevelt from the League of Struggle for Negro Rights and from the International Labor Defense. Both organizations have their national headquarters in the city.

Although the fact that Neal was kidnapped and carried across the state line from Alabama provides a clear case for federal intervention on the basis of the federal kidnaping law it is already clear that terrific pressure will have to be brought to bear on the government to bring action.
