U. S. Supreme Court Weighs Herndon Appeal

Washington D. C.,-CNA-Tne basic constitutional rights of workers were brilliantly defended by Whitnel North Seymour, white, in his appeal for the reversal of the chain-gang sentence of Angelo Herndon. The case was before the Supreme Court last week. Seymour was retained by the International Labor Defense.

The right of free speech, the right of Negro and white to organize and meet, the right of the unemployed and starving to demand relief were the issues involved in the Herndon case. The appeal also attacks the infamous Georgia "Insurrection law."

Herndon was arrested in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1932 for organizing a demonstration of jobless workers which resulted in additional unemployment relief. He was sentenced to 18-20 years on the chain-gang on trumped-up charges of "inciting to insurrec-
