PAUL ROBESON RECEIVES TENTH LINCOLN AWARD

New York (Calvin News Service) Paul Robeson, this week, became the tenth winner of the Lincoln High School Awards. The Brooklyn institution has been giving them out since 1934 to people like Mayor LaGuardia, Lewis J. Valentine, Lou Gehrig and Walter Damrosch. Robeson won over Irving Berlin, former Gov. Lehman and others. He is the first Negro to receive the award in the school which is nine tenths white of 4,000 students.

Mr. Robeson presented Gabriel R. Mason, principal with his new album "Songs of Free Men" and sang several songs for the students. He was chosen by

ANALYSIS SHOWS GOP VOTED TO OUST PICKENS ILLINOIS REPUBLICAN CONGRESSMEN SOLIDLY FOR HIS DISMISSAL

New York, N. Y.—The recent vote of 66 northern and border state Congressmen backing the attempted ouster of William Pickens, Treasury Department employee and Dies target, prompted the NAACP this week to warn Negro voters throughout the country to keep a close check on the records of their representatives and remember those records when the representatives come up for reelection. The NAACP pointed out that in the total of 136 votes against Pickens, 50 of the 66 cast by the northern and border Congressmen were Republican votes.

Illinois' 17 Republican Congressmen voted solidly for the dismissal of Pickens from the War Savings Staff of the Treasury Department on charges of subversive activity, made by the Dies Committee.

In a protest sent to the House of Representatives before the final vote of 267 against 136 which brought about the reinstatement, the NAACP outlined the career of Mr. Pickens who since his graduation from Yale in 1904 had been zealous in the fight for the rights of Negroes and other minorities. For 31 years he was an executive officer in the NAACP.

"Mr. Pickens and other officials are being persecuted on false and malicious charges of un-American activity, without fair or competent investigation, and without opportunity to be heard," the NAACP said. "The conduct of the men responsible for this attack would be more becoming to agents of the Gestapo than it is to those acting in the name of the name of the American Congress."

HASTIE ADDRESSES NATIONAL LAWYERS' GUILD DICKERSON SPEAKS ON FEPC

CHICAGO, Feb. 23 (ANP)—Judge William H. Hastie, former civilian aide to the secretary of war, spoke before the National Lawyers' Guild in its war convention held at the Hotel LaSalle here Saturday night. Judge Hastie discussed the issue of segregation of Negroes in the armed forces of the nation and described the particular situations which forced him to resign from the war department.

Ald. Earl B. Dickerson, a member of the President's Fair Employment Practice committee, discussed the contribution which the 13,000,000 Negroes of the country were prepared to make to the war effort if given protection against discrimination. Others who spoke were Maj. Gen. Myron C. Cramer, judge advocate general, U. S. Army; Sen. H. M. Kilgore of West Virginia; Leo Pressman, national
