WHEN IT DID NOT GIVE

It is not altogether clear what has happened in Omaha's power

One of the latest developments unofficially reported is that under the provisions of LB 204, the legislature gave a flat grant of authority to the people's power com mission to go ahead with its program without submitting the question to the people of Omaha.
