U. S. Congress will be asked for legislation on the soldier vote.

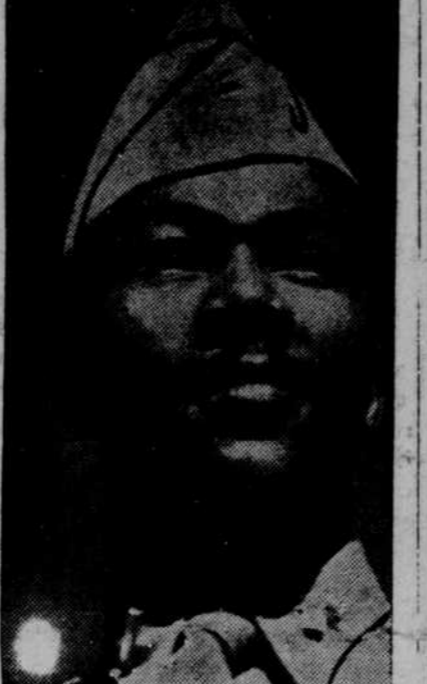
Packers Outlet one of the largest grocery stores in Pontiac, Mich destroyed by fire Sunday Dec. 26.

TO COLORADO TO ATTEND AUNT'S FUNERAL

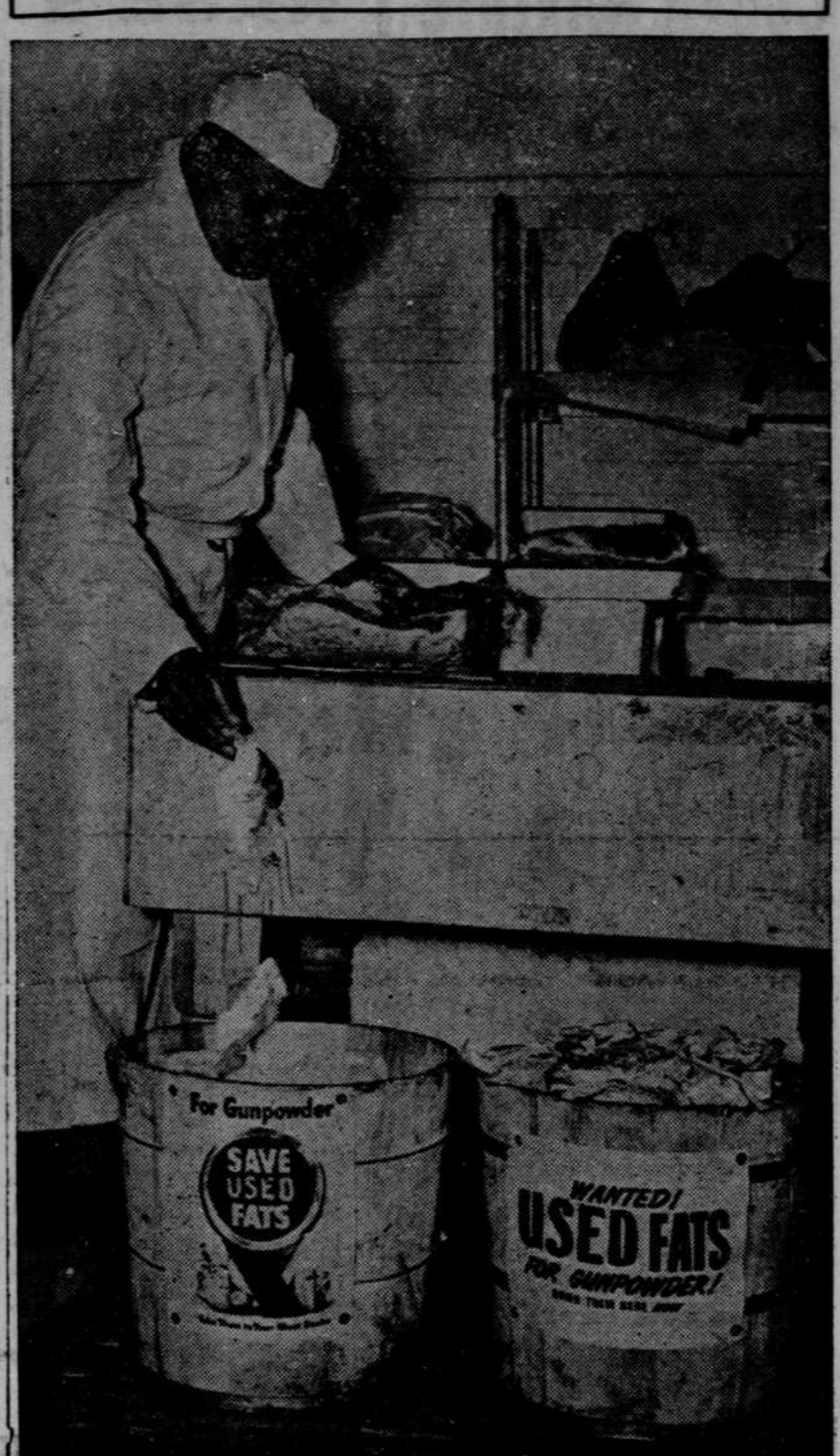

1 cup molasses 1 teaspoon vinegar
