The State Department gave as its reason for non-action in the matter, the fact that "it is a generally recognized practice in the intercourse of states, that each government has the right to regulate and if necessary to forbid, the migration of aliens into its territory."

Admitting this fact the NAACP in a second letter sent to the State Department today, insisted that our Government would not be going beyond the bounds of friendly intercourse between states, if representations are made to Panama to abolish the restriction order affecting Ne-

Action in the case of Panama recalls Mexico's abolition of a similar restrictive impration ruling last March. The NAACP in that case, protested the ban successfully.


