## U. S. REFUSES TO PROTEST PANAMA'S BAN ON NEGROES

New York, Oct. 26—The United States State Department has expressed itself as being unwilling to make representations at the present time to the Republic of Panama concerning that country's refusal to admit non-Spanish speaking American Negro citizens, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People announced here today.

The expression of the State Department was a reply to letter sent to Secretary of State Hull by the NAACP asking that our Government seek removal of the restriction against Negroes entering Panama "for the purposes of securing employment or for any other lawful purpose." The NAACP pointed out that the restriction against Negroes is an insult to more than one-tenth of the American population and thus an insult to the United States, and hurtful to the friendly relations between the two countries. Section 15 of Panama's current laws relating to immigration reads as follows: "The immigra-
