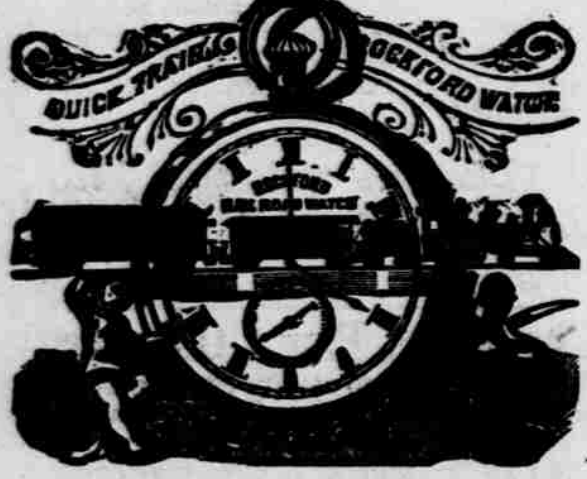

The administration might easily have completed the four Roach cruisers in 1885 if it had resisted the temptation of partisanship and had displayed energy and capacity. The passage of the deficiency bill with \$175,000 for the needed guns leaves the department without a shred of excuse for obstructing and delaying the armament of these vessels. The work should be undertaken at once, and the Atlanta's battery also be rendered serviceable. If the administration wishes to pursue a policy of adventure abroad, let us at least send some of the steel cruisers, which are of modern construction and fairly fast and formidable. A naval review of the old hulks off the coast of Morocco is not impressive. —New York Tribune.
