Congressman Morrow of California, made a good point in favor of protection when he showed that the native product of borax increased from 560,000 pounds in 1883 to 10,800,000 pounds in 1887. A duty was imposed on this commodity for the first time in 1883 and now the Mills bill proposes to put borax on the free list. It was the threat implied in this proposition that caused the failure of the great firm of William T. Coleman & Co. of San Francisco a few days since. Those who hold that a tariff necessarily increases the price of manufactures in the United States will find little to sustain their view in the fact that borax fell in price from 25 cents per pound in 1883 to 64 cents per pound in 1887.—Ex.

The secretary of the interior has recently rendered a decision in an appeal on a land contest case which will be of great interest to settlers. A settler who held a homestead which he attempted to commute after holding it three years was beaten on a contest when he offered proof. The evidence showed he had lived on the land only during the winter time and in the summer had worked in town and remained away from the land but used the proceeds of his work to improve the land and pay for it. The secretary reversed the decision of the local office and commissioners and held his title to be good as his efforts to hold the land had been in good faith and the money he had earned while away enabled him to improve it more than he would have been able to had he remained continuously on the land. The secretary held that the principal point to be considered in claims of settlers was whether he held the land in good faith and had used his best endeavors to improve it and render it valuable for a home.

Said Congressman R. W. Dunham yesterday: "We have been told by the political economists for years that without a heavy export trade our agricultural interests would be nearly ruined. While not caring to pose in the role of a crop expert, I give as my opinion that the farmers of America would make more money out of a wheat crop of 800,000,000 bushels than from one of 400,000,000. Consumers might be forced to pay a little more for their flour, but this would not amount to much as millers and transporters would be obliged to curtail their profits. This would help to even up living expenses. There would still be a considerable export trade to countries where we have little or no competition. If a surplus then remained I think it could be disposed of in Europe with a fair margin of profit to all parties concerned."—Inter Ocean.
