Rhode Island was the only state in the union requiring a property qualification for voting. At the recent election an amendment to the state constitution was adopted by a large majority, doing away with this abnoxious restriction. The law now provides that every male citizen above the age of twenty-one, who has resided two years in the state and six months in the city where he wishes to vote, is to have the right of suffrage. The new law has enfranchised several thousand citizens, and will materially swell Little Rhody's voting strength. What effect this addition will have on Rhode Island politics remains to be seen.
