The lower house of the Iowa legislature last Saturday passed the liquor bill.

There is no lack of good material for republican state nominations this fall, and it will not be difficult for the convention to name a winning ticket.

SOME of the local people venture the assertion that it will be brave men who will consent to be republican candidates in our senatorial and representative districts this fall.

The democratic New York Sun declares the Wilson tariff bill a "bill to make republicans" and says that even before its passage it has made "thousands, tens of thousands, yes, hundreds of thousands" of republicans out of people who voted the democratic ticket in 1892.
