Abe Lawrence has made a splendid sheriff and will receive a big majority. He is very popular as a citizen and an official.

E. J. Maxwell is well qualified to fill the position of county assessor. No one will be ashamed of having voted for him.

There is no question of the election of Geo. D. Carrington jr., for superintendent. He is an able young man and will make a splendid superintendent of public instruction.

G. B. Beveridge has made so good a record as clerk of the district court that there was much talk among the fusionists of endorsing him. They might just as well have done so, as he will be elected anyway.

D. J. A. Dirks has a good education, has had much experience in clerical work, and will perform the duties of the office of treasurer in a manner satisfactory to the citizens of the county. He should receive every republican vote.

Mr. Dirks is the eldest son of Rev. J. H. Dirks under whose tuition he was schooled. He is a man of excellent habits and well qualified for the office. He was once a candidate for clerk but fell a few votes short of election.—Granger.

Wm. Doolittle, the republican nominee for county commissioner from the third district, is a successful farmer and stock raiser, a man who has never been an office seeker, but who has made a record as a good citizen. He is a careful business man of good judgment, well liked and respected by all his neighbors and a man who will make a good commissioner.

C. R. Hacker has made an excellent record as county clerk. He has not done as too many of his predecessors, who took all the fees of the office, but has turned into the treasury the neat sum of \$638.39. There was no opposition in the convention to his renomination.

C. E. Ord, renominated for county commissioner from the second district, has made an enviable record during his first term. He is careful, uses good judgment in the expenditure of the people's money, energetic in looking after the needs of our citizens, and in all things makes one of the best commissioners Nemaha county ever had. So popular is he that the fusion convention had hard work to find a man who would accept the nomination against him, and some half dozen men who were placed in nomination before the convention flatly refused to make the hopeless run. His election is sure.

"Mr. Crichton has been a resident of the county for the past fifteen years. He has taught in the county, and for four years held the office of superintendent of public instruction, which office he ably and creditably filled. Of course he is a crank.
