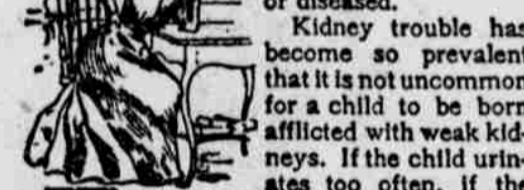

## Abe Lawrence's Record as Sheriff

Auburn Post  
The Herald last week tried to make its readers believe that Abe Lawrence had a team that could beat Cresceus' record, but an examination of the records show that Abe Lawrence is not the only sheriff that had a fast team.

On April 21, 1890, Sheriff Culwell filed a bill for 811 miles for summoning 40 men to serve on the grand and petit jury. This made him travel about 23 miles for every man summoned. The county must have been very thinly populated at that time.

The county has settled up some since as Mr. Lawrence only had to travel 11 miles per man according to the Herald's statement.

On Oct. 6, 1890, Mr. Culwell had a bill for summoning 24 men, a petit jury, 472 miles or about 20 miles per man. Again on April 21, 1891, he summoned a grand and petit jury of 40 he traveled 866 miles or 21 1/2 miles per man.

Again on November 16, 1891, he summoned a petit jury of 24 men and traveled 538 miles or 22 1/2 miles per man.

S. P. Glasgow had to travel 476 miles to summon a petit jury of 24 men, or a fraction over 19 miles per juror according to a bill dated Nov. 8, 1895.

Ex-Sheriff Cole according to a claim filed May 29, 1898, traveled 608 miles to find 24 men, or 25 1/2 miles per man.

On Feb. 3, 1899, W. G. Hughes filed a bill for summoning 11 jurors for 216 miles or 19 1/2 miles per man. These figures show that other sheriffs and deputies have had faster teams than the present one.

Ex-Sheriff Culwell has a number of bills on file showing that he traveled 300 miles to take a patient to the insane hospital at Lincoln at five cents per mile or \$15.00 for each trip.

There have been other sheriffs who have gone to China to serve papers on a person in St. Leroim.

The truth regarding the summoning of the 87 jurors in the Goldsberry trial is not as the Herald states done in two days. There were three separate trials. Guy Goldsberry was tried first and acquitted, then the old man was tried, convicted and sentenced for five years. Then the three Goldsberries were tried at one time and all convicted.

The three trials took 87 qualified jurors.

The court ordered the sheriff not to summon any juror who lived less than six miles of Auburn. This required the sheriff to work five nights and four days besides the work done by deputy sheriff Rohrs and a special deputy. For all this work of summoning these 87 jurors the sheriff and his deputy only received \$26.00 for mileage, or only about 3 1/2 miles per man.

Sheriff Lawrence summoned 111 jurors to the regular and special jurors in the Goldsberry case and received \$46.00 mileage.

Sheriff Culwell had a bill for mileage for \$43.30 for summoning 40 jurors.

Judge Jessen and a number of the lawyers complimented Sheriff Lawrence upon the manner by which he summoned by not summoning any one who could not qualify as a juror. Judge Jessen said the sheriff had saved the county at least \$1,000; that had he done as many sheriffs by summoning every man he met he could have run the cost to \$2,000 more. The total fees of the office of sheriff last year for all the work done by both Sheriff Lawrence and Deputy Rohrs amount to \$1462.68, and for the first nine months of this year they have only received \$1095.17. An inspection of the books of the sheriff's office show that Sheriff Lawrence has been the most economical and conservative sheriff that this county has ever had.

The voters should examine the records and see for themselves and not be prejudiced by the false impression given by the Herald.
