BITS ABOUT THE HOME.

A Few Suggestions as to Various Matters Coming Under the Housewife's Care.

Children's school lunch baskets need a little care to keep them sweet and pure. As often as once a month they should be dipped in hot salted water and then plunged into cold water. Dry in the sun if possible, or before the fire. If Japanese paper napkins are used instead of linen, the basket will be more easily kept in good condition.

Several green coffee beans left to soak in the unbeaten white of an egg will color cake icing a delicate green. The beans should be removed and the egg whipped and used for the icing, says a household authority.

A good and an inexpensive breakfast sweet is apricot marmalade made from canned apricots. Measure the fruit, and to each pint allow three-fourths of a pint of sugar. Cook over a slow fire, stirring once in awhile until the marmalade is thick.

It is rather discouraging to the would-be economical housekeeper to read newspaper and magazine accounts of how the parlors were refurnished at a cost too insignificant to mention. The process always includes "an old velvet dress I happened to have," or "the express cost me nothing, as a friend kindly brought it in her automobile." The humble imitator rarely happens to have an old velvet dress, and has to buy something new to take its place, and she usually pays the full express on whatever she brings from a distance. The worst feature of these misleading directions for achieving great results without expenditure is that it establishes a standard in the minds of the masculine members of the family which the housekeeper finds it hard to live up to.

For stuffed cabbage choose a fine head, from which cut the stalk and outer leaves. Put into boiling water and cook for ten minutes. Place the cabbage in cold water for half an hour, drain and wrap in a cheesecloth or thin muslin cloth. Remove the heart of the cabbage, and chop half of this fine and mix with minced ham and fresh breadcrumbs. Season and moisten with melted butter, and fill the hollow in the cabbage with the mixture. Put enough clear stock or water in a pot to cover half the cabbage and boil until tender. Remove the bandages before serving, and pour around it in the dish a little gravy made from the liquor in the pot, thickened with a roux of butter and flour and seasoned with tomato catsup or mushroom sauce.
