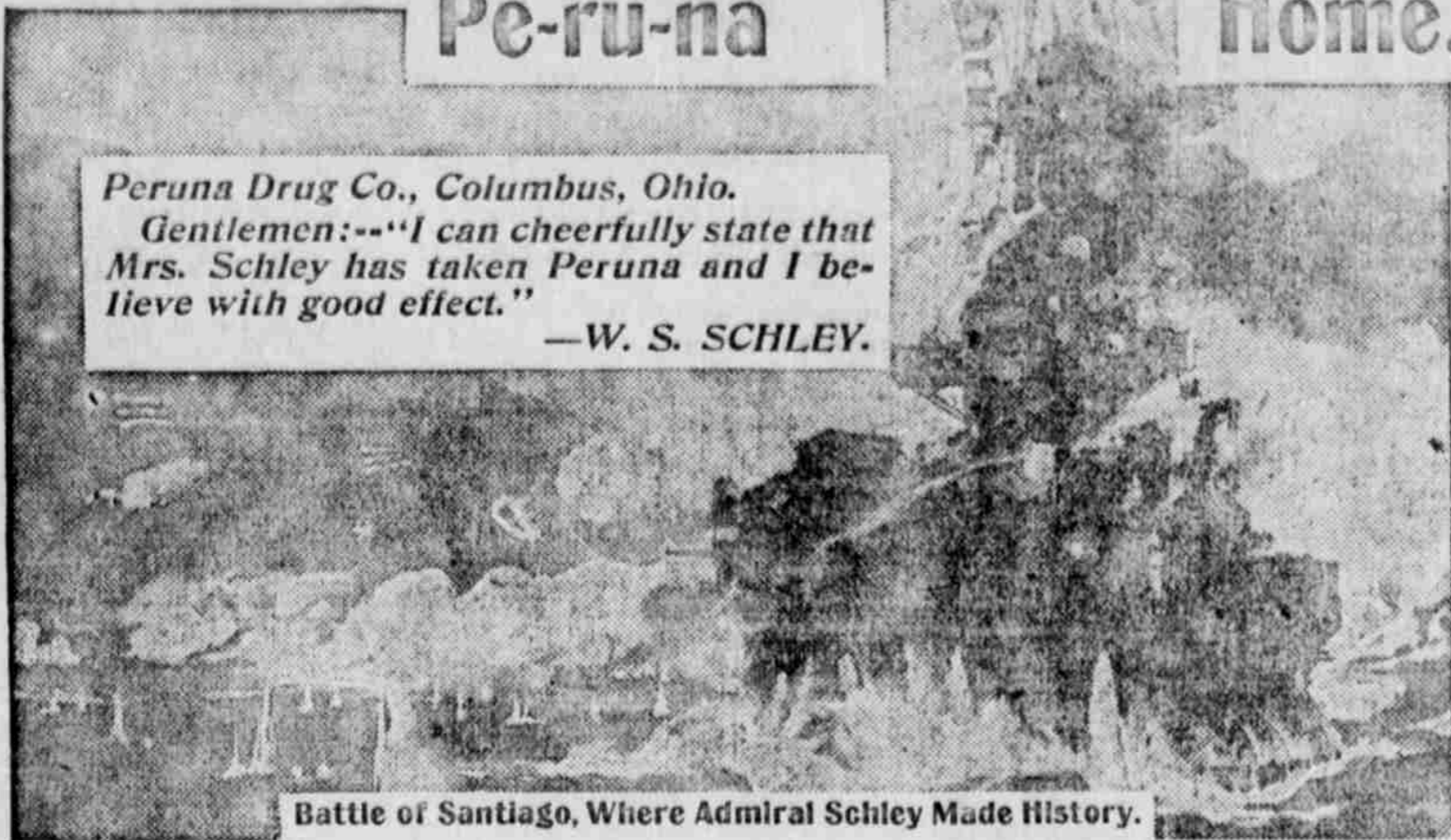

Battle of Santiago, Where Admiral Schley Made History.

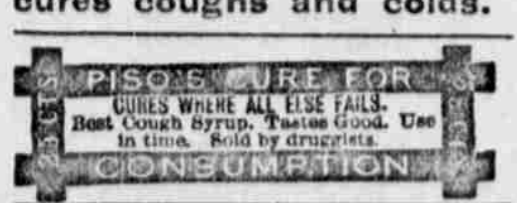
