Apple Shortcakes.

Make a paste as follows: Sift four cupfuls of pastry flour and four teaspoonfuls of baking powder together very thoroughly with two tablespoonfuls of powdered sugar and a half teaspoonful of salt. With the finger tips work in a cup of butter and two cups of milk. Roll out lightly without touching it more than is necessary. Bake fifteen minutes in a moderately hot oven. When done, cut into individual sizes with a biscuit cutter, split, butter and spread each piece with a strained apple sauce and serve very nervous and fearfully despondent. with whipped cream. These are very delicious also when made with preserves or any fresh crushed fruit.

Poor Man's Pudding. Cut crustless slices of graham toast into dice. Put a layer of these dice into the bottom of a greased pudding dish. Moisten with milk and sprinkle with granulated sugar. Cover with well-sweetened apple sauce. Add more bread dice, then apple sauce and proceed in this way until the dish is full. Let the top layer be of apple sauce. Strew with bread crumbs and sprinkle with cinnamon. Cover and bake in a hot oven for twenty minutes, then uucover and brown.
