PECULIAR PEOPLE OF SIFAN.

Their Worst Traits Are Hostility and Tribal Warfare.

Physically, the Sifans were the finest race of people that we saw in Central Asia, says a writer in Collier's Weekly. They were tall, robust, manly in bearing and possessed of very singular features. Notwithstanding the almost arctic coldness of the weather they were dressed in the thinnest of clothing, the children running about in a state of absolute nudity without any deleterious effects manifesting themselves from this apparently suicidal exposure.

Both males and females were possessed of an inordinate love of display, wearing enormous contrivances of silver or gold hanging from the neck. The women were a shade lighter than the men, and, judged by the Asiatic standard, really good-looking, with no traces of Chinese cast, but more nearly approaching the physical characteristics of the North American Indian. The general practice prevailed of shaving the head until it was entirely bald the effect of these shining pates when gathered in groups being ludicrous in the extreme.

The color of these Sifan Tibetan tribes is not uniform, however. Some are quite black, but many have copper colored faces, and on the lower Dji-chu there are detached tribes almost as light as the Caucasian races of southern Europe. They are slim and well made; they have high cheek bones; the nose is sometimes flat, like that of a negro, and sometimes aquiline. The females are especially distinguished by a light and elegant form and in their walk and erect manner of carrying themselves the effect is very striking. They are a vigorous race, bold, hardy, hospitable toward each other, generous to a fallen enemy, and enthusiastic lovers of warfare and courageous enterprise.

The Sifans are divided into hundreds of small tribes, which in turn are split up into numerous sept and clans, each deriving its name from some feature of the landscape or from some mythical legend or ancestor. These tribes are all matters of internal economy are independent of each other, but consolidate for purposes of security from alien aggression. The head men and the chiefs, called ulmas, compose the aristocracy of the country, and hold this titular dignity by hereditary descent in the male line and in the order of primogeniture. These chiefs, however, are little more than leaders in war, for the right of personal revenge which is fully admitted, limits their authority in matters of merely judicial import.

A strange and barbarous people they have many customs and ceremonial rites which it is but natural should be in keeping with their aboriginal natures. Their worst traits are un governable hostility toward one another and love of warfare. Each tribe is always at war with its neighbor and generally upon the most trivial pretext. Two men may quarrel over the possession of a knife or an equally valueless article. The aggrieved party returns to his tribe and reports the facts of the case to his chief. His right to the article in question is never considered it is enough that he should have quarreled over it. War is immediately declared on the tribe of his rival by sending messengers with arrows dipped in blood and the head of any unfortunate prisoner of war who may have been captured prior to the outbreak of hostilities.

WORLD'S SMALLEST AUTOMOBILE.



The cut is a representation of what is claimed to be the tiniest fully equipped motor car in the world. It is the property of a little English boy named George Du Cros, who is 5 years of age and is the youngest motorist in the country. This clever youngster is really a skilled chauffeur, as was shown by his recent participation in a contest at Hastings, England. Experiment Station Report.

The Eighteenth Annual Report of the Nebraska Experiment Station, just published, contains some striking results which should interest every farmer and lead him to send a request to the Experiment Station, at Lincoln, asking for bulletins published at this Station. The Station makes the following statements regarding a few of the results if experiments carried on at the Station.

The winter wheat production of the State has increased 10,000,000 bushels per year, due largely to the work of the Experiment Station.

Knerson oats, introduced from Russia by the Station, outyielded the common varieties by ten bushels per acre in central Nebraska. Experiments with corn to secure better adapted varieties have increased the yield 10,000,000 to 20,000,000 bushels, and will result in still further increase.

Experiments at the Station prove that land which has been seeded to alfalfa will grow from 10 to 25 bushels more corn per acre than other lands.

Apple scab has been almost perfectly controlled by spraying with Bordeaux mixture. Cedar rust on apple trees has been controlled with Bordeaux mixture. Straw mulches have greatly increased the yield of garden vegetables and improved the quality of cabbage, tomatoes, beans and cucumbers.

Milk fever has been treated with practically no loss, by inflating the udder of the cow with air when the first symptoms of the disease appeared.

Feeding experiments have shown that alfalfa hay and corn is the most economical ration for fattening steers. This ration gave a profit of \$8 per head more than where the corn and prairie hay was fed.

Extensive experiments in feeding alfalfa hay with grain to hogs are now in progress which show the great economic value of alfalfa when fed in connection with a grain ration.

Eighteen thousand hand separators have been purchased by farmers in the last six years, and the number of cows used for dairy purposes has increased 200,000 in this time.

One hundred and fifty farmers' institutes will be held during the season of 1904-1905, if sufficient funds are available.
