John W. Ritchey, for a number of years one of Brownville's leading merchants, has leased the Paris building and will move his stock of general merchandise to Nemaha as soon as the room can be shelved and countered. Nemaha is to be congratulated on getting Mr. Ritchey to move here.

The latest figures compiled by the State Bureau of Statistics show the total combined products of farm and factory in Nebraska during 1905 to have been worth \$511,431,476.42 as compared with \$501,582,193.03 for 1904 which indicates a ten million dollar increase each year. The largest individual item in this compilation is manufactured products at \$177,155,953. Live stock is valued at \$122,112,084; corn, \$97,485,297; winter wheat, \$25,641,223; spring wheat, \$3,299,406; oats, \$19,638,219; barley, \$2,192,742; rye, \$1,484,707. The dairy products totaled in value \$11,259,984 and poultry products \$10,215,512. The poultry figures are flattering to those engaged in that industry. They do not, of course, include values of blooded and fancy poultry. Other items making up the tabulation are alfalfa, sugar beets, hay, potatoes and "other soil crops."

These interesting facts are to be found in quarterly bulletin No. 7 issued by the Bureau.

OMAHA, Neb., Jan. 29.—Arrangements were perfected Saturday for the appeal of the Burlington railway tax case. It is to go directly to the United States supreme court, without being carried into the circuit court of appeals.

Attorney General Brown came to Omaha Saturday morning to confer with Charles J. Greene, the Burlington attorney, who presented the railroad case before Judge Munger in federal court. The appeal bond was fixed at \$250,000.

This case is one which was decided by Judge Munger several weeks ago against the railroad. The suit was brought by the Burlington to enjoin the county treasurers throughout the state from collecting delinquent taxes for the years 1904 and 1905 under a new law which increased the railroad's assessment.

Both the Burlington and the Union Pacific brought an injunction suit to enjoin the collection of taxes. Judge Munger's decision dissolved the injunction.

STATE FAIR NEWS

At their winter meeting the Nebraska State Board of Agriculture had an entirely new proposition confronting them in relation to election of the prominent officers. It has been customary for the Board to retain in office the Secretary and Treasurer, both of whom had died in the past year, so that an entire new list of leading officials have been selected. The ballots cast resulted in the election of Peter Youngers, Jr., of Geneva, President; E. Z. Russell, of Blair, Treasurer; and W. R. Mellor, of Loup City, Secretary. At the recommendation of Mr. Mellor, the retiring President, the Board passed a resolution permanently locating the Secretary's office at Lincoln, and the same can be found to the left of the north entrance on the main floor of the Capitol building.

Preston, Neb., Jan. 27.—It is now a substantial fact that there has been a valuable find of mineral wealth. At a depth of seventy feet a six-foot vein of lead ore has been uncovered, while eighteen feet lower a five-foot vein of good coal was exposed.

This mineral wealth is found on the Thacker farm, about two miles north of Preston. After finding lead at seventy feet and coal at eighty-eight feet in the same hole they dug twenty-six feet deeper and found nothing of consequence. The Pirate Mining company, which is doing the exploring, has leased over 800 acres of land in the locality of the find and luckily will not be hampered on the account of obtaining leases in the future.

As soon as a sufficient amount of money was raised, L. L. Aldrich and a set of men went to work. They dug for three months and sank three prospecting holes, but all to no avail. Then they set a drill at work in the bottom of one of the shafts and they struck a six-foot bed of lead at seventy feet. Drilling down eighteen feet more they struck a vein of coal five feet thick. Still they went down twenty-six feet more but found nothing of much importance.

The work will now be pushed with all possible speed and it shall be thoroughly tested, and if there is anything in it they will find it.
