EXACT COPY OF WRAPPER.

An enormous mass of water is used for suppressing fires in London. Last year it amounted to 20,000,000 gallons, or, expressed in weight, 120,465 tons. Of this huge quantity about one-sixth was taken from rivers and canals and the rest from the street main.

London has 1,000 ships and 9,000 sailors in its port every day. It has upwards of 75,000 persons annually in custody by police, 27,000 persons living in its common lodging-houses, 35,000 persons annually arrested and disorderly, and one-third of the crime of the country is committed within its radius.
