It is the Cause and Not the Effect of Physical Inflammation.

Inflammation and pain are so closely connected that a person who feels pain in the throat often complains of having a sore throat without examining the throat to see if it is really inflamed.

If the pain is calmed by anesthetics the inflammation also subsides. For example, proof that the inflammation of the mucous membrane of the nose and throat can be cured by anesthetics has been adduced, and if an anesthetic is injected into an incipient boil there is little subsequent inflammation.

As an anesthetic Spiess first employed orthoform, afterward novocain, a substitute for cocaine, the poisonous character of which makes it unsuitable for use.

The inflammation following operations on the tonsils, which is ordinarily very severe, was almost wholly prevented by application of orthoform before and after the operation.

It is too soon to attempt an explanation of these remarkable results. The inflammation appears to be a result of a reflex action transmitted by the sensory nerves.

CUBA'S HEALTH RECORD.

Poor Sanitation Throughout the Island, but Good Supply of Water.

More than 25,000 American visitors are said to have registered in Havana alone the past winter, declares the Pittsburg Dispatch. The southern part of the United States established a quarantine against Havana on March 15, although there has been no yellow fever this season in that city.

Consumption is said to be the cause of as many deaths in Havana as any other disease. Throughout Cuba the poor sanitary precautions are a subject of criticism on the part of foreigners, although there is comparatively a low death rate; but for the reason of the low death rate the Cubans are indignant at the quarantine of the southern ports of the United States.

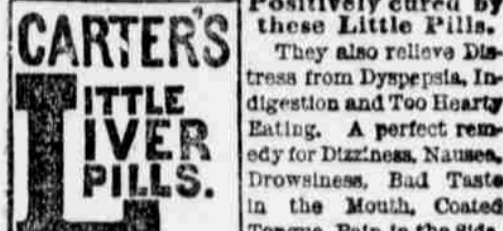
