

#### MUST LIVE IN APARTMENTS.

Only Twenty-five Private Dwellings Started in Manhattan in 6 Months. Manhattan is losing its private dwelling houses at a rapid rate.

Bullders have started only twentyfive dwellings in Mahattan during the first half of the year. In the meantime the destruction of old dwellings to make way for business expansion or for large flats has exceeded 500 houses.

The total estimated cost of building the twenty-five new dwellings is figured by the architects at \$1,335,000. This is an average of \$53,400 for each house. The most costly dwelling was planned for Robert S. Brewster, on the southeast corner of Park avenue and 70th street, 35x76.2. It will cost \$150,000. The cheapest dwellings comprised a row of three three-story houses on the northwest corner at 160th street and Haven avenue for Adolph Wurzburger. They will cost \$10,000 each; they are so far north, however, that they really ought not to be counted among the Manhattan projects.

In comparison with the small number of new private dwellings, the flat houses projected by Manhattan builders during the first half of the year number 664. This shows that familles who must make homes in Mahattan are being crowded steadily into narrow flat house districts.

In further comparison, the first half of the year has seen 800 private dwellings started in the Bronx, 2,300 ln Brooklyn, 1,800 in Queens. In all the suburbs, including New Jersey and Westchester, there are 7.300 one-family and two-family dwellings, under construction as a result of the half year's activity.

The suburban dwellings average \$3,-000 each in constructional cost. The favorite sites for such houses are in the far suburbs. Builders are improving with small houses the cheap outlying tands, which are soon to be drawn within quick transit lines of Manhattan business centers. The land nearer Manhattan, even in the suburbs, has advanced to such high prices that it is becoming available only for flat house improvements. Near the twenty-mile circle of the new rapid transit zone are found the most busy scenes of small house building.—New York World.

When Prof. Curie was run over and killed on a street of Paris not long ago the entire world recognized that it had lost one of its foremost experimenters, Yet it was only six years ago that the wonderful element, radium, which he to the site twice a day. and his wife had discovered, passed almost unnoticed among the exhibits in a Paris exhibition, and a stranger, seeking the physicist, found him only through the lucky help of a street

In the 1900 exhibition in Paris, says London Truth, the compilers of the catalogue and the jurors entirely overlooked the tiny vessel containing its speck of radium, which the Curies bad sent. An exhibitor of diamonds, annoyed because its presence spoiled the color of his jewels, had put it out of sight. An English visitor, however, who had read a reference to the discovery in an obscure journal, hunted it up, and later set out to find the discoverers.

He went to many places, the Mines School, the Sorbonne, and elsewhere, but no one in any of them could tell him anything of the Curies. At last, by a strange chance, he ran across a gamin who had heard of radium from a chum who worked as an attendant at the City of Paris Industrial Laboratory, where Curle then worked. By this roundabout information the Englishman was brought to Prof. Curie, who was a little amazed, but pleasantly soto find that some one was at last interested in what they were doing,

Mme. Curie, he said, had herself pounded in a mortar, with her own hands, all the pitchblende from which the speck of radium had been obtained. Pitchblende was costly, and she had not wasted a grain. She had ruined her aands in the work.

They were then speading every penny or pitchblende. Mme, Curle had given up gloves entirely, and was wearing very old and badly patched cheap shoes and old-fashioned clothes. The professor had on old shoes and a threadbare coat—his only coat. Their little girl was dresssed as cheaply. But by their economy and their diligence they had enriched humanity incalculably by their discoveries in radio-activity and their isolation of radium itself.


