The complaint includes allegations that the road does not employ a sufficient number of men to properly perform the work of keeping the tracks in a safe condition and that insufficient material is furnished to make necessary repairs. Other complaints, the dispatch says, will be filed against other roads.

From the repeated derailments and accidents happening on the Nebraska division of the Missouri Pacific our own State Railway commission might find good warrant for making an investigation in this state and find out the condition of the M. P. tracks in Nebraska. A timely action along this line might save an enormous loss of life and property.—Neb. City Tribune.

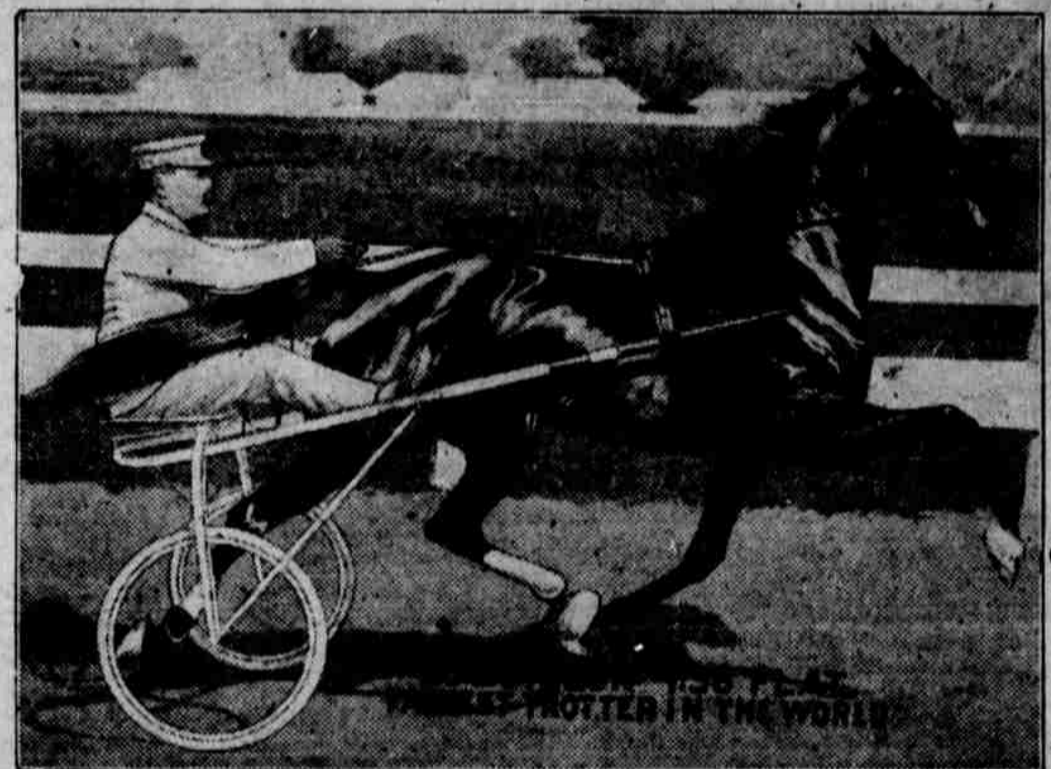
