Brownville's Homecoming

It was a Great Success

Thursday of last week was a great day for ancient Brownville. On that day a large number of former citizens gathered and enjoyed themselves so heartily that it was decided unanimously to have a homecoming every year on the 29th of August, or as near that date as possible. The exercises were held on the school grounds where so many of us got our education. E. H. Dort of Auburn, who was raised in Brownville, acted as chairman. Letters of regret were read from a number who could not be there. After music by the German-American band (a good band even if the members are only boys) and a prayer by Rev. E. H. Gould, Mrs. Alice A. Minick delivered an address of welcome, full of feeling. This was responded to by Rev. W. H. Chapman, now of Kansas City, Mo., in a fine address, full of reminiscences. His father helped Richard Brown hew the logs and the clapboards for the first house ever built in Brownville. He told of the first 4th of July celebration, just below town, when 400 Indians appeared and agreed to give a war dance if they were first given their dinner. This was done, but the Indians then wanted two bits (25 cents) each, and were told to "puckachee" and left. Mr. Chapman gave an old fashioned war whoop. Mr. Chapman attended the London academy, taught by Dr. McGrew. He taught his first school on Honey Creek.

Mrs. Elizabeth Murr sang "Jerusalem." She certainly has a fine voice.

In the afternoon there were five minute addresses by Judge J. H. Broady of Lincoln, A. W. Nickell of Beatrice, who was the first principal of the present brick school house, afterward a leading druggist, Alex. McKinney of Oklahoma, who told how he raised a big family on a Nemaha county farm, Dr. W. W. Keeling, who told of his marriage in early days by Judge Whitney, Dan Cole of Peru, the first auctioneer, and J. H. Dundaa, editor of the Granger, interspersed with vocal solos by Miss Pearl Minick, instrumental duet by Misses Mary and Jessie Steuteville, solos by Miss Marie Hoover and Miss Helen Hitte, all of which were fine.

The solos by Miss Perle Minick and the instrumental solos by Miss Marie Hoover were especially enjoyed by lovers of music. It is seldom we are treated to such fine music, from leaders in their profession, and we feel proud that old Brownville sent out such artists.

Geo. E. Dye, Geo. D. Carrington, sr., and Al Nace gave some stirring music with fife and drums.

The Brownville citizens and others who assisted in making arrangements were tendered a vote of thanks—Brownville for her generous hospitality and the manner in which the old town had been prepared for the occasion.

Everything passed off pleasantly, and the old timers had the best day of their lives. There was a big crowd but no disturbing element. There was no drunkenness.

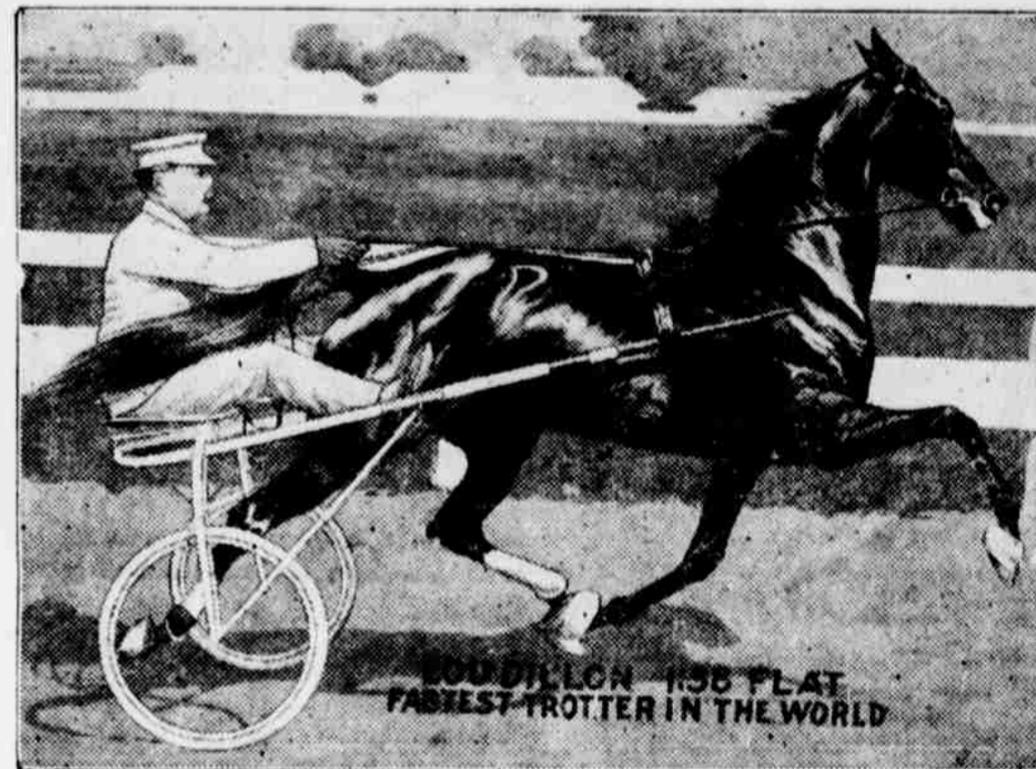
