The case of Titus vs. Moore, where G. N. Titus sued Ed Moore for damages for slander, was tried in the district court last week, going to the jury Friday evening. The jury agreed on a verdict during the night, and the next morning when court convened, it was read. Mr. Titus sued Mr Moore on three counts—That Mr. Moore had told first that G. N. Titus burned the barn and office building at the Titus nursery two years ago to get the insurance money. Second, that Titus had used the office for a gambling place. Third that G. N. Titus and his brother had burned the buildings for the insurance. The jury brought in a verdict of guilty on all three counts, assessing the damages at \$50 on each count, a total of \$150, which with the costs will amount to about \$1000, we are informed.

Mr. Moore has made application for a new trial and we understand has been granted 50 days time to file papers for that purpose.

Mr. Titus is satisfied with the verdict. He did not sue for the sake of the money, but to clear his character of the stain of the charges, though we believe that very few paid any attention to them, as Mr. Titus is too well known to have his reputation damaged to any extent by such charges.

There have been numerous changes in postoffices in Nemaha county since the early settlement. Some of the offices that have been discontinued are Bratton and Febing in Benton precinct, Clifton in Washington precinct, Grant in Lafayette precinct, London in London precinct, Hillsdale and Aspinwall in Aspinwall precinct, and now Bracken in Nemaha precinct. There have also been several changes in name and in some instances slight changes in location of offices. Brock was formerly Howard, Howe was formerly Sherman, Anburn and South Anburn were formerly Sheridan and Calvert, and Nemaha was formerly Nemaha City, which is the name of the incorporation now. There are at present eleven postoffices in the county—Anburn, South Anburn, Johnson, Brock, Julian, Glen Rock, Howe, Peru, Brownville, Nemaha and St. Deroin. Four of the thirteen precincts in the county have no postoffice in them—Washington, London, Aspinwall and Island—and two have two offices each—Douglas and Glen Rock.
