> WHEN AND HOW TO HARROW. Don't get into grain that is six or more inches high when the dew is on. Wait just long enough in the morning for the blades to dry off, and no longer. Set the teeth slightly slanting, not too much, and as a rule harrow crosswise of the rows, Break the surface thoroughly.

Grain that is six inches high or over, thick, with good width of blades and of good color, needs no harrowing.

If this advice seems too radical, then just try a part of your field, even a small part, and in two weeks be kind enough to report to me the results.
