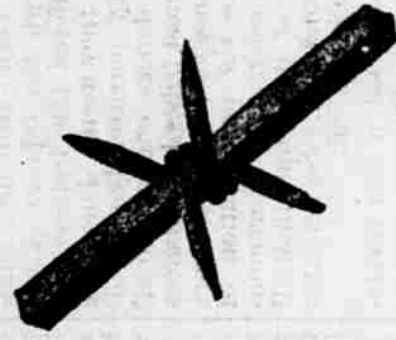

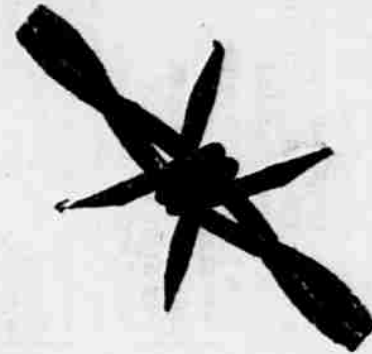

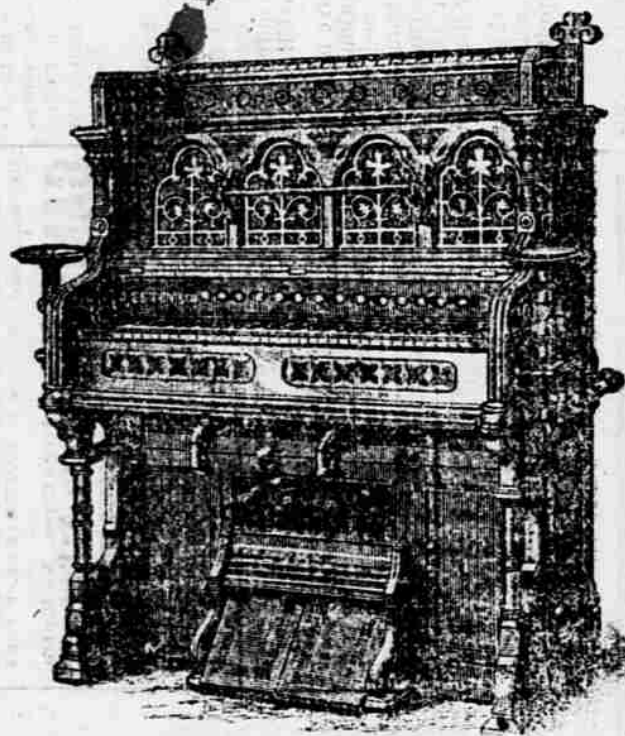

GENERAL NEWS.

THE town of Minden is booming. A contractor has advertised for twenty carpenters, offering the good round price of three dollars per day.

THE Schuyler Sugar and Syrup Manufacturing company has 145 acres of sugar cane growing, which will yield 25,000 to 30,000 gallons of syrup.

STEPHEN A DOUGLASS, son of the deceased senator, is lying seriously ill in Chicago. Friday he underwent a surgical operation growing out of an abscess which had formed.

MARY ANDERSON, the favorite of the American foot-lights, made her debut in London, last Saturday night, in "Ingomar." She was enthusiastically received, and had many re-calls.

HOUSTON, Texas has a population of 20,000, and three policemen. Recently, however, the order has been given for an increase to eight. It ought, therefore, to be an orderly town.

THREE Chinese—Lee You, Lee Ing and R. Bund—appeared at the common pleas court of Philadelphia, Saturday, and put on record their intention to become citizens of the United States.
