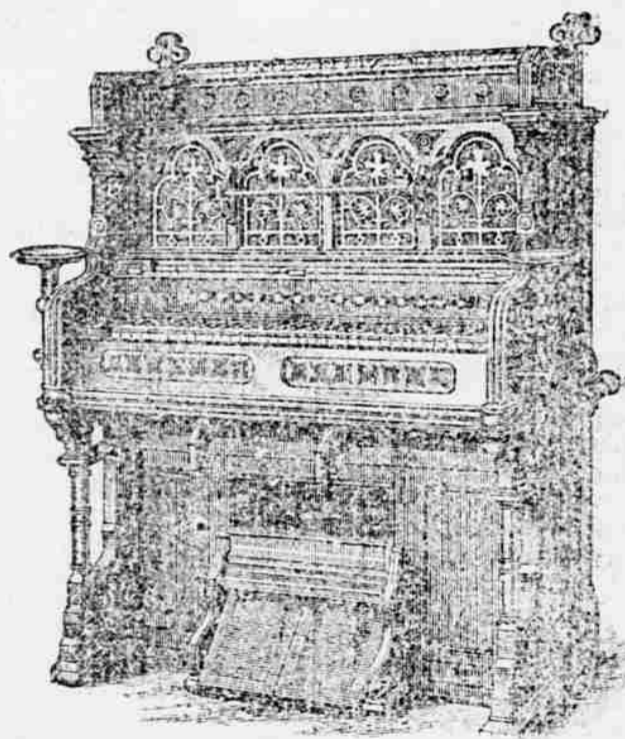

GENERAL NEWS.

DR. OLIVER WENDELL HOLMES carries a horse chestnut in his pocket to prevent rheumatism.

THERE were 1,250,000 new two-cent stamps sold at the postoffice the first day they were on sale in New York.

The great trot for \$5,000 between the celebrated trotters, Jay Eye See, and St. Julian came off at Fleetwood Park on Saturday. Jay Eye See won in three straight heats, time 2:18 1/2.

Mrs. LILY LANGTRY warmly denies that Oscar Wilde's play has failed. She wants to repay Oscar's services in discovering her beauty, by her being the first to find out his dramatic genius.

WORK on the Washington monument, which for the past two months has been temporarily suspended, will be resumed on Monday. It is expected that by the end of the working season this year, the shaft will have reached a height of 410 feet.

THE Department of Agriculture has received advices from Liverpool that a cargo of 1,000 sheep from Canada have been ordered slaughtered on account of one sheep said by the authorities there to have been infested with the scab on landing.

JOHN W. STEITH, an eccentric old man of St. Louis, died, and two weeks later his will was found in an old stove. He willed about \$1,750,000 of other people's property to various charities, and left the court house to an evangelist for a "Big Bethel."

SENATOR CULLOM, who succeeds David Davis, will not literally fill the latter's place, for he isn't much more than half as big, being only a medium-sized man. He is a good talker, and, like the average Illinois statesman, full of anecdotes and "little stories."

THE new ship of the Guion Line, the "Oregon," is said to be much faster than the Alaska, now the fastest ship on the sea. The Alaska recently made the trip between Queenstown and Sandy Hook in 6 days, 21 hours and 8 minutes—fastest time ever made by a steamship.

A TRAIN on the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway was attacked by a party of cowboys on Tuesday night at Cooledge, Kas., who killed the engineer and mortally wounded the fireman. The express messenger escaped unhurt, and protected the baggage which had attracted the robbers.

THE situation in the railroad rate war is unchanged. It is intimated that unless a compromise is effected in twenty hours the old lines will enter the conflict of cutting rates. The Louisville, New Albany & Chicago carried over one thousand passengers last week, while the old lines carried about the usual number of passengers at full rates.

THE case of ex-Senator Sharon and his alleged "wife" will be brought up in San Francisco, October 10. The opinion prevails in San Francisco that the case is one peculiar to that city, where a prominent man is not considered as broken in until he has been blackmailed or sued for breach of promise. The ex-senator is now at White Sulphur springs.

A TREMENDOUS rain fall of brief duration, accompanied by quite a strong wind, visited Kansas City on Monday evening. Cellars and sewers were flooded. The rain fell in an hour and a quarter, the time of the storm, was one and one-fifth inches. The storm came from the northwest and passed eastward. Telegraphic communication was considerably injured. At one time all wires to St. Louis were down. Dispatches indicated that the area of the storm was extensive, but no serious damage was reported.
