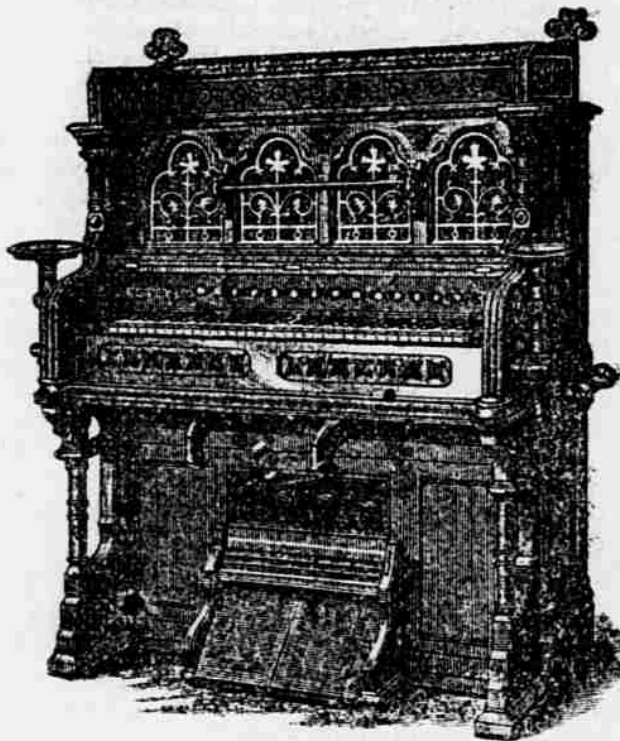

## GENERAL NEWS.

**BEN. BUTLER'S** attorney-general has decided that women are not "persons."

It is estimated that Cass county's apple crop will aggregate 200,000 bushels.

ORDER has been completely restored in Hayti. Fifteen hundred lives were lost and damage to the extent of four million dollars was done during the late massacre.

**JOAQUIN MILLER'S** mother, who is sixty years old, recently married a Portland, Oregon, youth of the tender age of twenty-two. Joaquin will be a kind father to his step-son.

**MARY ANDERSON** appeared October 27th, in the "Lady of Lyons," before a crowded and enthusiastic house. She was recalled several times, and renewed the success she achieved in "Ingomar."

**NEW YORK** spent \$40,000 for opera on Monday of last week, and the Bee says that "some of the snobs who scarcely know a symphony from a sardine, occupied seats for which they paid as high as \$20."

UPON the report of the commissioner of pensions, the secretary of the interior, to-day, suspended from practice before the interior department, Belva A. Lockwood, pension attorney of Washington. Belva's only drawback was that she had become "too smart" for her own good. "Cuteness" sometimes kills.

THE second world's exhibition in this country will be held in New Orleans, taking place in the winter of 1884-5, a season of the year when northerners will find the Crescent City a most delightful place to visit. New York and Boston both made efforts to secure the national show, but men could not be found who would guarantee the requisite amount of money.

AT Wampum, Pa., a piece of ground claimed by the Pittsburg, Cleveland and Toledo railroad and by the Pennsylvania road is in possession of the former, who have it fortified and garrisoned by twenty men. The Pennsylvania company sent fifty men to besiege it. There was skirmishing all day. Both sides sent for reinforcements. The tracklayers were assaulted by workmen from the furnace, but were driven off.

**MR. CHARLES MACKAY**, in the Pall Mall Gazette, gives the origin of the now much used designation "Masher." It went over to England from this country, into which it had been introduced by Irish emigrants. The word masher is derived from the Gaelic maise, pronounced masher, and signifying fine, handsome, and was originally applied in derision to a dandy. It is now in similar derision, appropriately applied to modern, undeveloped men, whose sole aim is to dress well and ogle ladies.

THE Texas Siftings recently contained quite a suggestion, though a very rude picture. Briefly it was this: There stands Bismark with the traditional long pipe in his mouth, stout and ruddy, representing the Prussian government; in front of him is the American hog, fat, sleek and undisturbed, his tail curling up over his back; Bismark is flying a six by fourteen boat to his hog-ship, and from the mouth of which floats a steamer on which Caesar's word—"Et tu Brute"—are written. The hog looks as if it would like to translate that sentence so as to make it read—"And you too, you brute you."—Gazette-Journal.
