WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 17, 1883. Though "the season" in the official social circles of the capital does not open until the first of January, there have been a few informal receptions, etc., and on some days the door-steps of certain residences have been pretty well littered with the little tissue slips dropped from packages of visiting cards. It must be an awful bore to be the wife of an official and receive this stream of callers on certain days, yet the ladies seem to like it and are even more ambitious than their husbands to occupy the positions placing them high in the social scale. There being no Mrs. Arthur in the White House, and Senator Anthony, who is to be President of the Senate, and really Vice President, being a bachelor, Mrs. Carlisle, the wife of the new Speaker, will occupy the position of society-leader this winter. At all official dinners Mrs. Carlisle, like Mrs. Keifer last year, will rank her husband, and if the President is present will take the position corresponding to his.
