SUNSTROKE.

It is very important that everyone should be able to make out a case of sunstroke when it occurs, and not mistake it for drunkenness or apoplexy.

When a person is "dead drunk" his countenance, breathing and pulse are very like those of a sunstroke case. Besides, the person sunstruck may have taken a glass of beer or a small amount of alcohol just before the attack.

MEANS OF PREVENTION. The prevention of sun-stroke is of very great importance, in view of the high rate of mortality of its victims and the serious after effects in those who recover from the immediate symptoms.

Water should be drunk freely to supply the loss from the blood by way of the skin, lungs and kidneys. This is fully as important as avoidance of excessive exercise.

TREATMENT. The treatment of the attack is sufficiently simple. No time should be lost in removing the sufferer to a cool, shady, airy place.

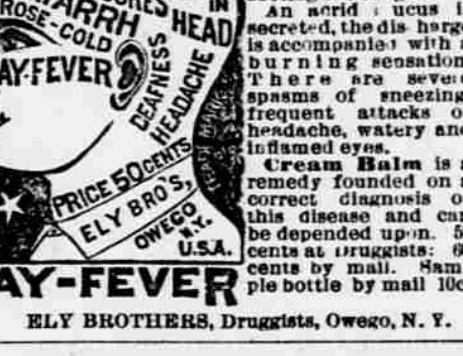

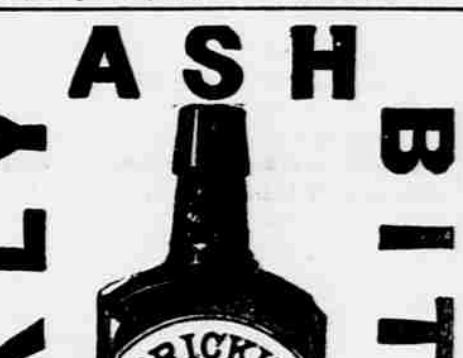
