Lincoln Journal: Samuel F. Miller. general freight and passenger agent of the Northwestern railway, in a statement concerning the Tripp conuty Inud rush, says.

"During the twelve-day period of the Tripp county opening we had dis trains went-bound and 155 trains east bound, on which we handled approximatchy \$2,000 people in either direction. These trains were run in two or more sections, at times having as high as six sections of one train, each section having from eight to ten cars Blied with people.

"With exceptionally heavy move ment in epher afrection on a given day it is easy to see how very difficult it was to have enough equipment on hand to take care of other trains following, and at six or twelve hour peri ods, when it is understood that the other heavy movement has not yet had a chance to so back.
