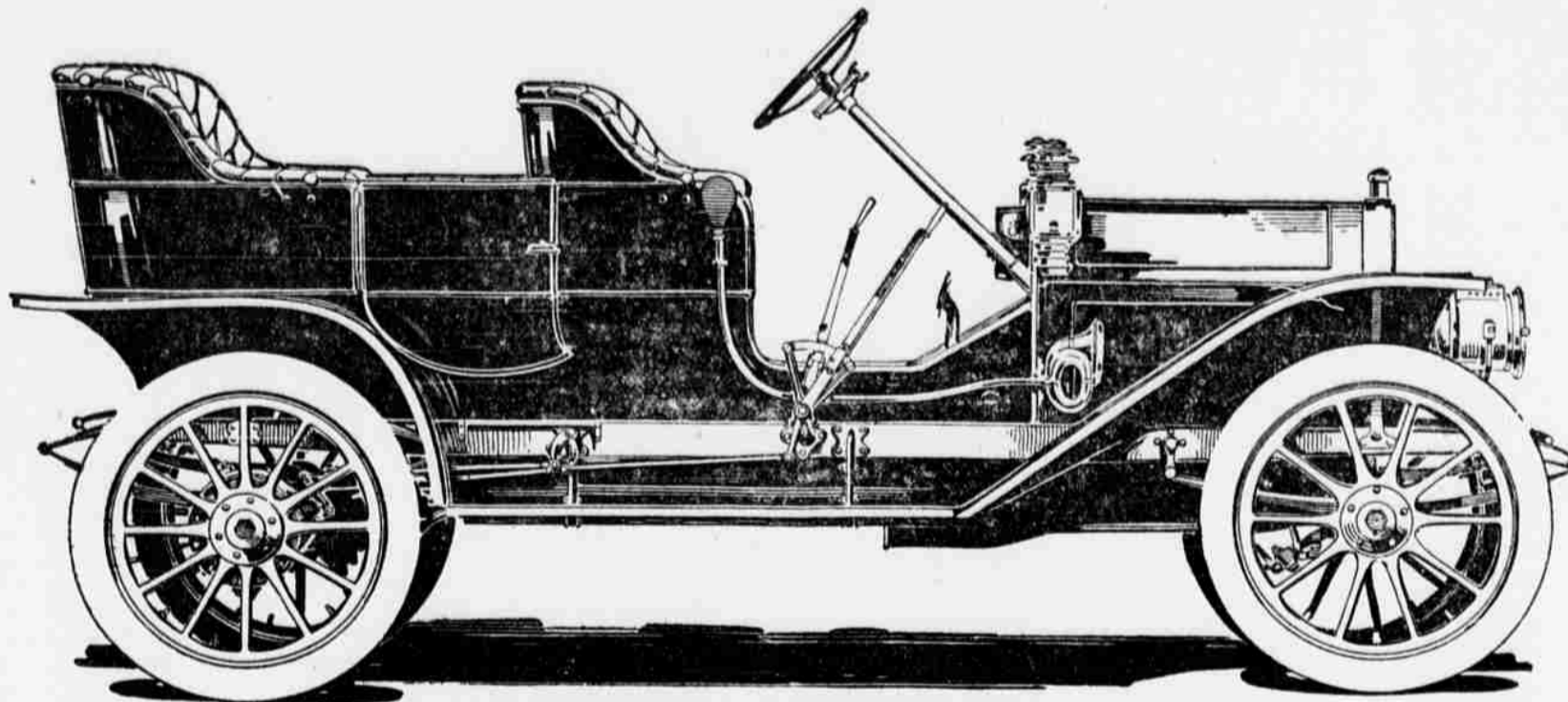

### Nominate Your Candidate

Any respectable lady over 15 years of age is eligible, provided conditions set forth below are complied with.

### Who May Enter This Contest

A ballot will be printed every day during the life of the contest. The ballot will count ten votes.

All ballots will be dated and will be void unless received at The Daily News office on or before the expiration date as printed. All ballots must be left or sent direct to the Contest Department of The Daily News, postage fully prepaid. No employee of The Daily News or member of employee's family will be eligible as a candidate.

The Daily News reserves the right to make additions to the list of prizes.

In accepting nominations, all candidates must accept and agree to abide by above conditions.

### The Prizes--What They Are

The grand prize will be a 30-H. P., four cylinder Overland Automobile. This machine is listed at \$1,300.00 at the factory and is equipped with side lights, tail lights, powerful headlights, and a gas generator.
