

**Italiener werden zurückgewiesen!**

Am 19. August (Mitternacht) und Aufbruch nach dem Saal. Das österreichisch-ungarische Kriegsschiff unter dem Kommando des Kapitäns Luigi, das schwere Angriffe der Italiener sich und schließlich den Krieg unternehmen wurden, das jedoch die österreichische Verteidigung an der ganzen Front festhielt. Der Bericht laut des Kapitäns:

Die Italiener setzten ihre Angriffe auf die Front von Salcano bis nach Verona und gegen die Abwehr von Gerg und den Schützling südlich von Tripach bis nach Verona fort. Ununterbrochen mit großer Wut anstürmend, während sie die anstehenden Abschnitte unter heftigen Artilleriebeschüssen. Unsere Truppen schlugen alle Sturmangriffe zurück und hielten ihre Stellungen an der ganzen Front entlang nach heftigen Dankschreiben, dem Feinde schwere Verluste zufügend.

Feindliche Vorrückungsversuche nahe Verna und Gogora, sowie an der Dolomitenfront auf Greda Dolomita wurden ebenfalls zurückgeschlagen.

Der Frau Ann A. Pratt gehörige Stall, an der nordl. 33. Str., wurde gestern nachmittags ein Raub der Flammen. Ueber 80 Hühner fielen demselben zum Opfer. Der vierjährige Sohn hatte das Hühnerhaus durch Unvorsichtigkeit angezündet. Sofortiges Eingreifen der Feuerwehre befreite das Feuer auf seinen Ausbruch.

**Nur keine Erübung der amer. Freundschaft!**

London, 19. August. — Berichte der englischen, besonders Englands Politik Irland gegenüber, haben in den Vereinigten Staaten Bedacht und Mißbilligung erregt. Die Zeitung der „Manchester Guardian“ in einem getreuen Artikel, diese Tatsache darf man nicht zu leicht nehmen, schreibt die Zeitung weiter, denn die Mißbilligung der Vereinigten Staaten wird notwendig sein, wenn ein dauernder Frieden von den freimüthigen friedlichen Mächten geschlossen werden soll.

Der britische Kommandobefehl, die „Schwarze Vire“ und die Verklappung der neutralen Post hätten bis zum gewissen Grade die amerikanischen Sympathien beeinträchtigt. Derartige wäre zwar gegenwärtig nicht von großer Wichtigkeit, und wenn nichts anderes überlegt werden müßte, dürften wir zu der Annahme berechtigt sein, daß keine ernstlichen Störungen in den englisch-amerikanischen Beziehungen eintreten werden.

**Jahresüberschuß der Post \$5,200,000!**

Washington, 19. August. — Generalpostmeister Burleson hat Präsident Wilson benachrichtigt, daß der Ueberschuß der Postverwaltung in dem am 30. Juni abgelaufenen Geschäftsjahr \$5,200,000 betrug. Ein Ueberschuß dieser Betrag ist dem Bundeshaushalt überwiehen worden.

**Gegen bestückte Handelsdampfer!**

Berlin, 19. August. (Zukunftspost.) — Aus Ostindien wird gemeldet, daß der norwegische Justizminister die Vorkriegszeit in sämtlichen norwegischen Häfen angewiesen hat, jeden ankommenden Handelsdampfer daraufhin zu untersuchen, ob er Geschütze an Bord hat, und in diesem Falle die Militärbehörden von dieser Lastfreie in Kenntnis zu setzen. Derartige bestückte Schiffe dürfen nicht ohne Erlaubnis verladen, die norwegischen Häfen zu verlassen, bis die Militärbehörden dazu ihre Einwilligung gegeben. (Hier folgt einfach Herr Wilson, eine Bestückung von Handelsdampfern ist erlaubt.)

**Deutschland und die Schweiz.**

Berlin, 19. Aug. (Zukunftspost.) — Die Schweizer Regierung wird die Verhandlungen über den Austausch von Handelsartikeln mit der deutschen Regierung wieder aufnehmen, da die Konferenzen in Paris fehlgeschlagen sind. (Im Juni forderte die deutsche Regierung, daß die Schweiz die Ausfuhr von Baumwolle und Nahrungsmitteln, die von deutschen Agenten angekauft worden waren, gestatte, und drohte mit einem Verbot der Ausfuhr von Kohle, Eisen und anderen für die Schweizer Industrie nötigen Artikeln. Die alliierten Mächte protestierten, und die Schweiz laudte in dem Bemühen, die Meinungsverschiedenheiten zu beseitigen, Vertreter nach Paris. Auf den Beschluß dieser Bemühungen bezieht sich diese Depesche.)

**Die Leiche eines Kaiser-Neffen!**

Paris, 19. Aug. — Es ist immer noch nicht aufgeklärt, was aus der Leiche des Anfangs des Krieges gefallenen Infanterie-Leutnants Prinz Maximilian von Hessen geworden ist. Er war ein Sohn der jüngsten Schwester des deutschen Kaisers, Prinzessin Karl Ludwig von Hessen. Auch die Bemühungen des Papstes, das Verbleiben der Leiche zu ermitteln, sollen, wie die Zeitung „Petit Parisien“ schreibt, erfolglos geblieben sein. Es hieß, die Leiche soll nach einem Trappisten-Kloster gebracht worden sein, das jedoch Tags darauf geräumt werden mußte; jetzt aber behauptet diese Zeitung, die Leiche rufe auf einem kleinen Friedhofe in Gagebois, und ein armer Mann hätte tatsächlich einen Sarg mit 30 Franken erhalten, in den sie gelegt wurde, nachdem sie zuerst einfach vergraben worden war.

**Letzter Appell des Präsidenten!**

Washington, 19. Aug. — Auf die Angabe der Bahnpäsidenten, welche heute vormittag wiederum im Weißen Hause erschienen waren, daß sie unünnlich einen Achtstundentag beistimmen könnten, veröffentlichte Herr Wilson heute eine Bekanntmachung. Dasselbe bedeutet ein Ultimatum an die Bahnen und fordert sie auf, zur Erbe der Achtstundentag einzutreten, da die die Sanktion des Publikums hat. Nur durch Erfüllung könnten die Bahnen ausfinden, ob sie die Mehrkosten tragen könnten.

Der Präsident verlangt, daß die Bahnen den bereits von den Angehörigen angenommenen Bedingungen ebenfalls zustimmen, und hält sie völlig für die Folgen verantwortlich, wenn sie sich weigern, seinen Angebot nachzukommen. Die Besprechung endete um 12:20.

**County-Steuer bleiben dieselben.**

Trag des eifrigen Fortschritts des Vorstehers des Finanzkomitees Frank Bell werden die Grundbesitzer im Douglas County dieselben hohen Steuern zu bezahlen haben wie letztes Jahr. Die Höhe derselben beträgt 16.6 pro Mille. Der Verbleibende eine Steuer von 15.9 pro Mille, wurde aber von den anderen Kommissaren mit der Begründung nicht genehmigt, daß das County in diesem Jahr \$25,000.00 für eine Brücke über den Rotten Fluß, die ins Saunders County führt, beizutragen muß.

Das Ergebnis der Steuern wird auf sieben Fonds wie folgt verteilt: Allgemeiner Fond, 9 pro Mille; Armenhaus, 2 pro Mille; Straßenfond, 1 pro Mille; Brückenfond, 1.3 pro Mille; Hilfsfonds, 4 pro Mille; Bondauszahlungsfond, 2.56 pro Mille; Soldaten-Hilfsfond, 14 pro Mille.

Ueber 6,000 befristete County-Obliigationen werden erst in ungefähr einer Woche oder zehn Tagen zur Ausgabe gelangen.
