The above represents the entire expenses from the date headquarters withdrew its general support February 1 to July 31. The budget proposed by the War Camp committee of which Mr. S. S. Caldwell was chairman, called for \$8,442 for one year. For the six months just closed the expenses amounted to \$3,381.56 or less than half that much. In other words, if the work had continued for the entire year the total expenses would have amounted to \$6,763.12. If the original budget had been granted we would have had a balance at the end of the year of \$1,678.88.

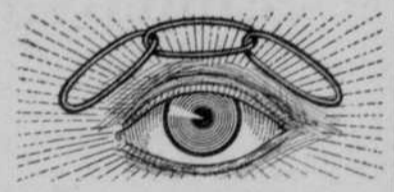
