Gotham Who Claim Descent From Esau and Call Themselves "True Jews"-Hold to Old and New Testament Scriptures and Wear Crucifixes.

SABBATIC NOTIONS

(By the Associated Negro Press), NEW YORK, Nov. 18 .- A cult of self-styled "true Jew" Negroes have been discovered in Harlem by B. Levitin, a reporter on the Jewish daily. the Forward. They are led by a chief prophet, a certain mysterious Roberand claim to have seventy members in this country. Twelve elders head the board of directors of this organization, which, on its letterheads, calls itself "The Hebrew Settlement Work-

When Mr. Levitin, in the interests of American Jewry, traced the claimants to the title of "true Jews," he found them holding their meetings in the back of a co-operative grocery store at 2367 Seventh avenue. This part of the store they considered too sacred for his intrusion, but they consented to give him the interview unler a tree at the corner of 135th

The secretary of the cult was at going to persecute these "real Jews."

"You white Jews are afraid," he
