





There is a resolution before the Massachusetts Legislature to memorialize Congress in favor of the passage of the so-called Dyer Anti-Lynching Bill, which gives the Federal Government jurisdiction over situations in which the danger of lynching is involved.

The humanity and justice of granting protection to our Negro citizens and, in fact, assuring Constitutional protection of the due process of law to all our citizens is too plain to need discussion.

The colored population of the world is beginning to come into its own. We heard the other day of the Negro regiment from Jamaica which refused at the order of the British to sail or India, there to help the British hold down in their misery and oppression the people of India.

We are making enemies or ourselves beyond our borders, and enemies which may become important enemies, by our practice of lynching Perhaps more important than all, we are losing the respect of the thoughtful, just and discriminating people of the world by this practice of lawlessness and bruality.-Los Angeles Examiner, 4-28-22.
