

In 1911 the dancer decided to return to Germany and demanded a passport for herself and Louis, but it was refused by the French on the ground that Louis was a French subject and could not be adopted by a German. In 1914, when Louis-now calling himself Battling Siki-was 15 years old, he enlisted in the French army and in a few months arrived at the front. There he covered himself with glory and received the Croix de Guerre and the Military Medal.

Globe National Bank of Harlem Will Be First Institution of Its Kind to Recognize Race on Directorate.

Large Deposits Anticipated from Harlem's Dense Population-Race **Operates Eighty** Banks.

New York, N. Y., Nov. 3 .- The Globe National Bank, now in process of organization, is said to be the first national bank in the United States to recognize the Negro population by having a board of directors of both and actively interested in organizing the bank.

"The election of colored members to the Globe National Bank, to be opened at Seventh avenue and 135th street, will be held after the formal opening of the bank. This step will open the directorates of the 12,000 national banks in the United States to the Negro race.

"There are eighty Negro banks in the United States. All of these banks will have the opportunity of sending one of their young men to the bank to learn the principles of national banking," Mr. Black said.
