MARCUS GARVEY'S PLEA FOR EXECUTIVE CLEMENCY HAS BEEN REJECTED

U. N. I. A. Leader Must Serve a Least One-third of Five-year Sentence-He Will Then Be Deported

Washington, D. C .- President Coolidge has denied the petition of Marcus Garvey, president general U. N I. A., for executive clemency, which sought to free Garvey from the Federal prison at Atlanta, Ga., where he has served one year of his five-year sentence.

In his petition for clemency, Garvey also asked to be allowed to remain order to straigehtn up some "business affairs" before being deported.
