Escaloped Apples

- 6 large apples 1/4 teaspoon Cinnamon 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 tablespoon lemon juice 1/4 cup water 1/4 cup butter or vitaminized margerine 1/4 cup sifted enriched flour 3/4 cup brown sugar

Wash and core apples. Cut in thin slices. Place in well-oiled baking dish. Sprinkle cinnamon and salt over apples. Add lemon juice and water. Cream butter or margerine. Add sugar and flour. Blend until crumblike. Sprinkle crumbly mixture over apples. Bake in hot oven (400° F.) about 30 minutes or until apples are tender.

To discourage mice from chewing books stored on a shelf, place pieces of gum camphor on the shelves.
