FORCUPINES

1 lb. ground beef
1/2 cup bread crumbs
1/2 cup chipped onions
2 tablespoons chopped green pepper
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon paprika
1/2 cup uncooked rice
1 10-oz. can tomato soup
2 cups boiling water
Combine meat, crumbs, onion, green pepper, salt and paprika. Mix well. Shape into eight balls. Roll each ball in rice and press rice into meat so that as it cooks it will cling to the meat. Place meat balls in pan: cover with tomato soup and boiling water. Cover well and simmer for 45 minutes. This will make four to six servings.

BANANA CUP CAKES

2 cups sifted enriched flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
2 eggs, beaten
1 teaspoon grated orange rind
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 cup mashed bananas
2 tablespoons milk
1/2 cup chopped nuts
Sift together flour, baking powder, soda and salt. Cream together shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, mixing

well. Add orange rind, lemon rind and vanilla extract. Add flour mixture to creamed mixture alternately with bananas and milk. Fold in nuts. Fill greased 3-inch muffin pans two-thirds full. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) about 25 minutes. Yield: About 14 3-inch cup cakes.

Don't try to put fresh pineapple in gelatin and expect the latter to jell. Pineapple contains an enzyme which peptizes the gelatin. Cook the fruit first.
