Sinclair Lewis Dies in Rome

ROME, Italy-(ANP)-Sinclair Lewis, author of "Kingsblood Royal," novel on prejudice against Negroes, died here in Rome last week following a short ill-

His body was placed in state at the Protestant cemetery chapel here where the great Shelley and Keats, English poets of the past, are buried.

Lewis would have been 66 on Feb. 7 if he had lived. He was the Villa Elettra clinic in Rome. He ailment, and also had been attacked by bronchial pneumonia, Dec. 31.

Recognized as one of the world's great social novelists, Lewis is most famed for his novel, "Main Street," published in 1920, and "Babbitt," published in 1922.

He wrote numerous other great novels attacking nearly every phase of American life during the '20's and early '30's.

In recent years, his most famous novel was "Kingsblood Royal" which attacked the racial problem in the United States. This book, a sensation and a shock to many Americans, reached the best seller lists. It was published in 1947.

Lewis had lived in Italy during the last two years of his life because he wanted to die here. He met his second wife, the famed newspaper columnist, Dorothy Thompson, here, and he also wrote 'Babbit" here.
