

Announces Three New Scholarships

NEW YORK. (ANP). Three national scholarships honoring Negro achievement were among 24 scholarships approved last week by the national board of the Young Women's Christian association at its semi-annual meeting.

Negroes honored in these awards were:

Mrs. Mary McLeod Bethune, educator and women's leader. Money for this award was raised by a special committee. Mrs. Lisle Carter of the board announced it.

Mrs. Cordelia Winn, for many years a member of the national board staff. Miss Mamie Davis of the national field staff of the YWCA announced it.

Delta Sigma Theta, a national sorority, Miss Dorothy Height, national president of the Deltas and also a member of the national board, announced this award.

She said the sorority pledged itself to provide a full award on the basis that women of all races should be prepared to share in new opportunities and responsibilities as more doors are opened on a basis of equality.

A total of 60 board members attending this meeting reported that \$60,000 of a goal of \$100,000 had been collected for the 24 scholarships. This program provides more training for staff members to maintain and strengthen a corps of qualified staff leaders. Mrs. Kendall Emerson is chairman of the national scholarship fund committee.

Among other well-known women honored by the YWCA through these scholarships are Mrs. Robert E. Speer, former president of the board; Mrs. John H. Finley, member of the board, and the late Dr. Emily Hickman, former professor of history of the New Jersey College for Women.

CHAMPAIGN, ILL.—(ANP) — The Illinois track team, where not many years ago such as Herb McKenley and Bill Mathis dusted the cinders, will feature three Negro track men this year.

This trio includes Henry Cryer, Dick Coleman, and Thomas Floyd.

Top rated member is Henry Cryer, sophomore from DuSable high in Chicago. Already he has cracker the school's indoor record in the 880. His top time for the half mile has been 1:53.9 to beat the old Illini mark of 1:54.5.

Coleman is a junior from Canton, Ill. This year he already has cleared better than 14 feet in the pole vault, but he is overshadowed by his teammate, Don Laz, captain of the squad, who recently became the second man to vault more than 15 feet. Sophomore Thomas Floyd of

Gary, Ind., is expected to show progress in the high jump department. At present he is not expected to be a meet winner, as his top leap has been only 6 feet 2 inches.

To return to Coleman, it may be noted that he is a left handed vaulter, whom his coach, Leo T. Johnson, predicts will become the "greatest left-handed vaulter in history."
